



Alfred Douglas Smith

Alfred Douglas Smith, 84 formerly of Halifax Road in Danville died on Wednesday, July 23, 2014 in the Golden Living Center in Martinsville, VA after being in declining health for the past several years.

Mr. Smith was born in the Callands Community of Pittsylvania County on November 3, 1929 a son of the late William Irving Smith and Mary Virgin Pearson Smith. Mr. Smith was a graduate of the former Callands High School and he had attended Averett College. He had lived most of his life in Danville, Lexington and on the Eastern Shore of VA. Mr. Smith had worked as an auditor for the Natural Bridge Hotel & Resort for over 30 years and also the former Howard Johnson's in Danville as auditor and clerk until his retirement. He was a member of the former First Christian Church where he served as Chairman of the Board, Deacon and on the Board of Trustee's prior to becoming a member of the West End Christian Church.
