Ann Pharis Evans, 91, of 620 Westview Drive, Danville, VA, died Thursday, August 14, 2014 at Danville Regional Medical Center after being in declining health since January.

Born May 23, 1923, in Martinsville, VA, she was the daughter of the late John Hix Pharis, Sr. and Martha Bates Pharis.
