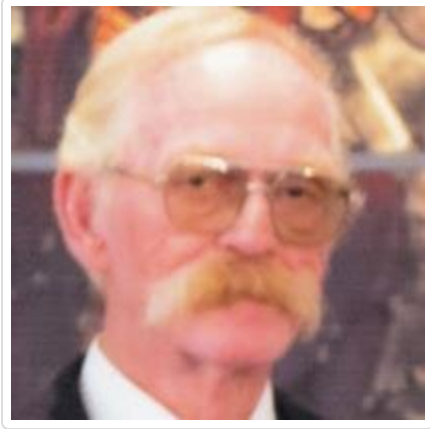




Douglas Nelson Dix
