Virginia Evelyn Groff Aaron, age 89, the beloved wife of the late Conley Lee Aaron, Jr, went to be with him on September 27, 2016 and through the grace of their Heavenly Father continue together their journey of eternal life. Conley and Evelyn were married on September 3, 1944 and were together for nearly 46 years. They were co-owners of Aaron Company, which specialized in screenprinting garments and other items.

She was born at Dry Fork, Virginia on October 25, 1926 to John Clark Groff, Sr and Virginia Lee Lewis (Groff), and grew up in Pittsylvania County and Danville. Her two brothers Ryland Groff and John Clark Groff Jr both of Raleigh, North Carolina predeceased her, leaving her the last descendant of her family line.

Her paternal grandparents, Jean H. Graf and Elisa Hirshbrunner Graf, and their family, emigrated from Switzerland to Pittsylvania County in 1871 and farmed at White Oak Mountain. Her maternal grandparents were Judson Lewis and Mary Ella Davis (Lewis) also of the county.
