Faye Cox Knowles of 233 Rocklawn Avenue died Tuesday, November 13, 2018 at her residence after being in declining health for a number of years. She was born in Danville a daughter of Frank L. Cox, Sr. and Hazel Searce Cox and lived in Danville her entire life. She worked 31 years for F.W. Woolworth's in downtown Danville and then worked as a Deputy for the Danville Sheriff's Department, retiring after 12 years.

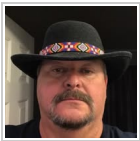
