Fred Taylor, Jr., 75, of 447 Berry Hill Bridge Road Ruffin, NC, died Friday, September 6, 2013 at Hospice of Rockingham County after a decline in health for the past year.

Born July 3, 1938 in Grifton, NC he was a son of the late Fred C. Taylor and Inez Bell Taylor.

Mr. Taylor spent most of the life in the Maryland area where he worked for R.M.C. Research Corp. in Arlington, VA. He moved to Ruffin, NC in 2012. He served in the U.S. Army and was of the Baptist Faith.
