Born in Danville, VA on October 8, 1944, a son of the late Rev. Fred Albert Hayes and Lavidia Fitzgerald Hayes.

Mr. Hayes served in the U.S. Army during the Vietnam War. He was a long distance Truck Driver for Hardy Brothers.

He was a member of Danville Calvary Church of the Nazarene.

On March 3, 2001 he married, Beverly Hamilton Hayes, who survives.
