Gary Alan Sigsbey, 86, of 265 Georges Lane Lot 18, Blairs, VA died on April 10, 2017 at Danville Regional Medical Center after being in declining health for the past few weeks.

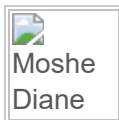
