Kathy Smith Thomas was called to her Heavenly Home on Monday, February 15, 2016, after a decline in health since April 2011.

She was born on February 18, 1954 in Danville, VA to her late parents, W.H. Smith, Jr. and Page Nichols Smith. Kathy graduated from George Washington High School and later enrolled at Danville Community College where she met her husband, Butch. They were married on June 30, 1973 and he survives of the home.

She first worked for the J. W. Mayhew, DDS. After seven years, she was employed by the local cable system and retired after 32 years of employment from Comcast. She was a lifelong member of North Main Baptist Church.

Kathy is survived by two children, Kristen, of Roanoke, VA and Brett, of Blairs, VA. She also leaves behind two brothers Chip (Barbara) of Lillington, NC and Gary of Durham, NC; her Aunt Peggy; her brother-in-law, Randy Thomas (Tonda), Pamela Baggerly, Sheila T. “It is with deep regret that I shall be unable to be in Danville for my sister's memorial service on February 19, 2016. Since having learned of Kathy's untimely death on February 15, I have been unable adequately to articulate my sorrow to the members of my immediate family, though I trust Butch, Kristen, and Mr. B. know that my grief has been -- and is -- nearly overwhelming. I bear the singular distinction of everyone remaining in my family of having known Kathy from the time of her birth in 1954.
