Nancy "Jus-Nan-C" Lovelace Hill, 85, of Greensboro, NC, died Wednesday, April 5, 2017 at Morehead Memorial Hospital in Eden, NC.

Prior to moving to Greensboro, Retail Merchants Association of Danville, VA employed her for ten years.
